

21st Century Leadership and ICT

A two-day workshop Sponsored by the NSW Computer Education Group (NSWCEG) and The Australian Council for Educational Leaders (ACEL)

The 21st century challenges educational leaders to re-think the mission of school and their roles in pursuing that mission. This two-day, hands-on workshop addresses this challenge and the thinking that administrators must do to move their organizations forward.

School leaders who are informed and comfortable with technology become key players in leading and supporting technology integration activities.

Using the milestones identified by the *Partnership for 21st Century Skills - Learning & Teaching; Leading & Managing; Partnering* - workshop participants will explore how leaders can respond to the difficulties and opportunities presented by the postmodern, globally-connected, media-driven culture of the Information/Digital Age.

Participants will apply knowledge of specific leadership behaviors, strategies, and concerns to create a prioritized list of action steps for their school or district that will lead to powerful learning for all students.

- Participation in activities designed to assist school leaders in development of a shared vision that acknowledges the characteristics and needs of the MySpace Generation.
- Use of Web 2.0 tools to enhance and support instruction, and to facilitate and support collaborative technology-enriched learning environments.
- Use of Web 2.0 tools to model routine and effective use of technology, employ technology for communication and collaboration, and maintain an awareness of emerging technologies and their potential uses in education.
- Participation in activities designed to assist school leaders in modeling and promoting responsible use of technology.

Participants will also examine resources to support teaching and staff development, emerging trends in digital tools and media, as well as social, legal, and ethical issues related to a digital society.

Topics will include:

- New understandings about how people learn;
- The rapidly changing social and cultural context of schooling;
- Essential conditions for 21st century learning;
- Leading for equity;
- Information-based educational practice;
- Uses of media and tools;
- Understanding by design;
- Dynamic infrastructures to support communities of learning
- Leading for change.

Participants will examine resources to support teaching and staff development, emerging trends in digital tools and media, making meaning of data in support of learning, as well as social, legal, and ethical issues related to a digital society.

Follow-up online sessions, discussions and exchanges (modeling the use of Web 2.0 tools) will enable participants to pursue topics of particular interest in greater depth.
